Elements and values affecting the final grade

During the entire course of the subject, particular attention is paid to the activity of individual students (20% of the final grade, 80% of the exam results), consisting in the ability to make correct cause-and-effect conclusions about the legal framework of veterinary legislation, with particular emphasis on the principles of administrative control of infectious animal diseases and the role and tasks of the professional veterinary self-government.
