

RULES FOR THE EVALUATION OF APPLICATIONS FOR THE RECTOR'S SCHOLARSHIP

The application for the Rector's scholarship is attached as Attachment no 10 to the regulations. When applying for the Rector's scholarship on the basis of scientific, artistic or sporting achievements, the student is required to attach, as appropriate:

- 1) Attachment no 10a – applies to students admitted to the first year of Bachelor's or long-cycle Master's degree programmes in the year of their secondary school leaving examination
- 2) Attachment no 10b – scientific achievements
- 3) Attachment no 10c – artistic achievements
- 4) Attachment no 10d – sporting achievements
- 5) documents certifying achievements in accordance with the requirements

I. RULES FOR SCORING THE ACHIEVEMENTS OF FIRST-YEAR BACHELOR'S AND LONG-CYCLE MASTER'S DEGREE STUDENTS – to be completed ATTACHMENT no 10a

II. OUTSTANDING ACADEMIC RESULTS

Points awarded for the grade point average according to the formula below, taking into account the minimum grade point average for which points are awarded = 4.00:

$$\text{points for average grade} = (x - 3) * 100$$

x - average grade obtained for the previous year of study

Example:

A student obtains an average grade of 4.57 for the previous year of study.

$$\text{points for average grade} = (4,57 - 3) * 100 = 157 \text{ points}$$

III. SCIENTIFIC ACHIEVEMENTS – to be completed in ATTACHMENT no 10b

Scientific achievements are understood as those listed and defined in point 6.

1. A student applying for a scholarship may not derive or receive any financial benefits in connection with the certificates of activity included in the application.
2. Scientific achievements shall be confirmed in accordance with the guidelines set out in point 6.
3. Points shall only be awarded if the documentation is complete.
4. Points shall only be awarded once for a given achievement.

PUBLISHING SHEET – a document containing at least 20,000 characters with spaces.

MONOGRAPH – a scientific study that meets all of the following conditions: it has a volume of at least 6 publishing sheets; is a concise, thematically coherent scientific study with a publishing review, contains a scientific bibliography, is published as a book or separate volume, presents a specific issue in an original and creative manner, and has an ISBN number.

SCIENTIFIC ARTICLE – an article presenting the results of original empirical, theoretical, technical or analytical research, containing the title, authors' names and surnames along with their affiliations, and presenting the current state of knowledge, research methodology, the research process, results and conclusions, and a list of references (bibliography).

CHAPTER IN A MONOGRAPH – a scientific study with a volume of at least 1 publishing sheet.

1. Authorship or co-authorship of a chapter in **a research monograph** – a scientific article presenting the results of original empirical research.
2. Authorship or co-authorship of a chapter in **a review monograph** – a scientific article summarising the current state of knowledge in a given research area. A review article integrates and interprets the results of original scientific research to date, but does not have to contain original research results.

POPULAR SCIENCE ARTICLE – an article published in a journal presenting scientific issues in a manner accessible to non-specialists, with a minimum length of 0.5 publishing sheets.

SCIENTIFIC CONFERENCE – a scientific meeting at which papers and posters are presented. The category ‘conferences’ also includes symposia, expert meetings and scientific sessions, which are scored in the same way as scientific conferences. Active participation in a conference is understood as delivering a paper, giving a presentation or presenting a poster.

1. At a single conference, **points can be awarded for a maximum of 5 presentations** (a total of 5 presentations, regardless of whether they are papers or posters).
2. An international conference is defined as a conference attended by speakers with **at least 3 foreign papers**.
3. A national conference is defined as a conference **attended by speakers from other national academic centres**. An academic centre is defined as the location where a higher education institution is based.
4. Points can be awarded for participation in both in-person and online conferences.

PRESENTATION – a lecture given by one or two persons to all conference participants in a plenary session or during a thematic session.

1. A maximum of 5 points can be awarded for presentations at a single conference.
2. The same presentation given at two conferences is awarded points only once.

POSTER – a scientific poster presented in physical or electronic form (or displayed) during a poster session at a scientific conference.

1. The same poster presented at two conferences is scored only once.

PATENT – a right granted by the state, which gives the holder the exclusive right to use the invention for a specified period of time. An invention that is the subject of a patent must be novel, have an inventive step and be industrially applicable.

1. In the case of simultaneous scoring in the categories 'authorship or co-authorship of an invention or utility model' or 'patent', **points are awarded only for the highest-scoring achievement.**

UTILITY MODELS AND INVENTIONS – inventions and utility models that are subject to protection, for which the Polish Patent Office grants exclusive rights. Patents are granted for inventions, and protection rights are granted for utility models.

1. **Scoring in the case of an application.**

RESEARCH GRANT – projects involving basic research or development work, for which funding has been allocated from external and/or university sources.

The scope of the grant is determined by the source of funding.

SCIENTIFIC COMPETITION – a procedure aimed at selecting the best participant in a scientific undertaking, focusing on the knowledge and intellect of the participant who solves tasks that require theoretical knowledge or has a specified time to prepare a project before the final presentation deadline, e.g. a business plan competition, at a specified time and place.

SKILL-BASED COMPETITION – a procedure aimed at selecting the best participant in a given place and at a given time. The competitions focus on manual activities that must be performed in a strictly defined manner at a specific time, or on using one's skills and knowledge to direct, for example, an animal in order to achieve the desired effect, e.g. catering competitions, surveying competitions, competitions involving dogs, etc.

Determining the scope of a scientific/skills competition:

1. **International scope** – at least 3 entities from outside Poland participate.
2. **National scope** – 5 other entities participate and the name must include information about the national scope.

EDUCATIONAL WORKSHOPS – an event during which participants actively take part in practical classes or discussions led by individuals who are substantively prepared to conduct the meeting.

EVENT ORGANISATION – organisation is understood in particular as activities such as: administrative tasks, including obtaining permits, creating the visual identity of the event, and performing logistical/technical tasks.

1. Points for event organisation are only awarded if the person reporting the above achievement is a representative of the Main Organiser.
2. There may be two or more organisers. Information about the organisers (student organisation/research club) should be included on the event website, posters, etc.

ACTIVE PARTICIPATION IN THE EVENT – the student's active contribution to the implementation of a scientific project at a specific time and place during its duration.

1. **Active participation in the event includes**, for example, presenting stands at Open Days or participating in education fairs.

1. Artistic achievements are understood as the achievements listed and defined in point 6.
2. A student applying for a scholarship may not derive or receive any financial benefits in connection with the certificates of activity included in the application.
3. Artistic achievements shall be confirmed in accordance with the guidelines set out in point 6.
4. Points shall only be awarded if the documentation is complete.
5. Points shall only be awarded once for a given achievement.

ART COMPETITION – a procedure aimed at selecting one or more winners from among a group of the best participants who meet specific criteria. The competition may consist of several stages (parts), or it may be cyclical and repeatable (subsequent editions). Prizes are awarded to one or several winners, in which case their places are determined (first, second, etc.). Each awarded participant is a laureate of the competition.

1. Competitions held on the Internet (e.g. on social media) are not eligible for scoring. Entering such an achievement is equivalent to awarding **0 points**.
2. If a given competition is divided into categories, e.g. contemporary dance and traditional dance or sacred music and regional music, a separate number of points is awarded **for each category, which are then added together**.

EXHIBITION – a specific place for presenting a single type of artistic work within a specific time frame and scope (photographs, books, paintings, poems, musical works, handicrafts, drawings, etc.) that is the original work of one or more participants (literary, musical, art clubs, etc.).

ART PRESENTATION – a live public performance of a specific scope aimed at presenting a work or artistic works at a given moment (musical, visual, choreographic, literary, photographic, etc.) which are the participant's own work or part of the artistic programme of a given cultural institution (band, choir, orchestra, theatre, etc.) to which they belong, in a designated place, e.g. a stage, auditorium, theatre, amphitheatre.

1. With the exception of artistic performances for commercial purposes, private events, corporate events, family events, etc., entering such an achievement is equivalent to being awarded **0 points**.

Determining the scope of an exhibition and artistic presentation:

1. **International scope** – a project in which at least one active participant from outside Poland took part or whose main audience is foreign.
2. **National scope** – a project in which at least one active participant from academic centres outside the province in which the project takes place took part, or the main audience is from regions other than the Lublin Voivodship.
3. **Regional coverage** – a project that does not meet the requirements specified above, taking

- place in the Lublin region or whose main audience is the public from the Lublin Voivodship.
4. **University coverage** – a project taking place on university premises, addressed to the academic community.

PUBLICATION OF AN ARTISTIC WORK – this is the release of a work on a physical or electronic medium, in particular it may be: a printed item (book, magazine, volume, newspaper, etc.), electronic (e-book), as well as musical (CD, studio recording, including podcasts). It may be an online publication on the website of the University of Life Sciences in Lublin or another website of an important institution.

EVENT ORGANISATION – organisation is understood in particular as activities such as: administrative tasks, including obtaining permits, creating the visual identity of the event, and performing logistical/technical tasks.

1. Points for organising an event are only awarded if the person submitting the achievement is a representative of the Main Organiser.
2. There may be two or more organisers. Information about the organisers (student organisation/research club) should be included on the event website, posters, etc.

ACTIVE PARTICIPATION IN THE EVENT – the student's active contribution to the implementation of an artistic project at a specific time and place during its duration.

Active participation in the event includes, for example, presenting stands at Open Days, assisting in the preparation of the Faculty's photography exhibition, and other events.

ARTISTIC FRAMEWORK OF THE EVENT – performance with the ULSL banner, framework of Holy Mass and university ceremonies with singing and/or dancing, and other types of events. **The main purpose of the performance is not to present artistic values**, but to raise the prestige of the event through artistic elements.

V. SPORTS ACHIEVEMENTS – to be completed in ATTACHMENT no 10d

1. Sports achievements are understood as the achievements listed and defined in point 7.
2. A student applying for a scholarship may not derive or receive any financial benefits in connection with the certificates of activity included in the application.
3. Sports achievements shall be confirmed in accordance with the guidelines set out in point 7.
4. Points shall only be awarded if the documentation is complete.
5. **Documents must be verified by the Academic Sports Association of the University of Life Sciences in Lublin/Centre for Physical Culture and Sport of the University of Life Sciences in Lublin and bear the stamp of the Academic Sports Association of the University of Life Sciences in Lublin, otherwise 0 points will be awarded for sporting achievements.**

Polish Academic Championships (PAC) – a series of sporting competitions organised in Poland for students enrolled at universities. The PAC consists of two stages: semi-finals and finals.

Polish Integration Championships (PIC) – a series of nationwide sports competitions for people with disabilities; points are awarded based on the rules governing the Polish Academic Championships.

Overall classification – the overall PAC classification includes points scored by a competitor/university in a given discipline in which the competitor/university was classified in the PAC competition.

Classification of SLSU university types – the classification of Social and Life Sciences Universities (SLSU) includes points scored by a competitor/university belonging to the SLSU type in a given discipline in which the competitor/university was classified in the PAC competition.

1. If a student participates in one or **more sports disciplines, the points are added together.**
2. If points are awarded **simultaneously in the individual and team classifications, the points are added together.**
3. In the case of multiple points in the individual classification, **the highest-scoring achievement should be taken into account.**
4. In the case of scoring simultaneously in the general classification and the university type classification during the Polish Academic Championships, **the points are not added together. CHAMPIONSHIPS – sports competitions of a given scope bringing together the best competitors: World Championships, World Academic/University Championships, European Championships, European Academic/University Championships, Polish Championships.

NATIONAL FINALS OF THE FIRST-YEAR STUDENT GAMES – national competitions organised annually in disciplines such as futsal, basketball, volleyball, cross-country running, swimming, table tennis and rowing ergometer.

ORGANISATION OF THE EVENT – organisation is understood in particular as activities such as: administrative tasks, including obtaining permits, creating the visual identity of the event, and performing logistical/technical tasks.

1. Points for ORGANISATION OF THE EVENT are only awarded if the person submitting the achievement is a representative of the Main Organiser, e.g. GIS Conference – the main organiser is the Student Spatial Planning Club, so the club members are responsible for **organising the event**. Members of other clubs who help out **take an active part in the event**.
2. There may be two or more organisers. Information about the organisers (student organisation/academic club) should be provided on the event website, posters, etc.

ACTIVE PARTICIPATION IN THE EVENT – the student's active contribution to the implementation of an artistic project at a specific time and place during its duration.

Women's individual tournament - the order of universities in the tournament (for the overall score) is determined by the sum of the points of the two highest-ranked players from a given university; in the event of a tie, the higher place of the best player shall be decisive. A university is classified if it participates in the team tournament. Medals for places 1-3 in individual university types are awarded on condition that at least six competitors of that type participate in a given tournament.
