

Discrimination

is an unfair treatment based on characteristics such as:

disability
sexual orientation
age
religion
social status
nationality
ethnicity

Types of discrimination:

Direct and indirect discrimination are two types of unequal treatment of persons or groups based on their protected characteristics, such as age, disability, gender, sexual orientation or race.

Direct discrimination


involves treating someone worse than others in a similar situation because of their protected characteristic.

Indirect discrimination

involves the use of policies or practices that appear neutral but actually discriminate against certain individuals or groups.
