






Typeform

- Great for creating visually appealing surveys or quizzes that gather input before or after a session.
 Good for asynchronous engagement or reflections.












Padlet

- Collaborative
- Real-time
- Open-ended
- Visual Wall
- collecting questions or resources, and co-creating content. Useful in both live sessions and as a follow-up reflection board.











Canva Board

- Visual design
- Collaborative
- Templates
- Storytelling
- Excellent for visual brainstorming, designing posters, or collaborative mapping. Helps learners structure ideas visually and creatively.









ArtPlacer

- Immersive
- Curatorial thinking
- Spatial reasoning
- Visualisation
- Useful for students in creative disciplines (e.g. art, architecture, museum studies) to curate exhibitions or place objects in virtual spaces. Stimulates spatial and aesthetic literacy.

Mara's Story.



The river was a living thing to the people of Vukovar. The villagers said it carried memories, old and worn, in its currents — stories of joy, sorrow, and the whispered secrets of the land.

Mara had always felt the river's pull, as if it knew her better than she knew herself. As a child, she would sit on its banks, dip her fingers into the cool water and feel the soft push. It was here, by the water's edge, that she felt the world slow down.

Her grandmother used to tell her that the river wasn't just water. "It's life itself," she'd say. "It nourishes, it heals, but it also remembers. Every drop that flows through its veins has touched the earth. It carries the weight of all that has been and all that will be."



Mara believed this and felt it deep in her bones. When the drought came, she wasn't just afraid of the dry fields and dying crops — she was afraid of what would happen if the river dried up too. It wasn't just a source of water; it was the pulse

As she stood at the river's edge, she placed her hand in the shallow water. The water was warm, sluggish, but it still moved. Mara closed her eyes, hoping, wishing that the river would hear her, that it would find the strength to flow strong and full once more.

One afternoon, Mara stumbled upon an old, weathered map that was hidden away in her grandmother's chest. The map showed the river as it once was, flowing through thick forests and rich, fertile lands. But when Mara compared it to the river she knew now, she could see how the landscape has changed — the forests have thinned, the banks have shifted, and the once-wide waterway have


