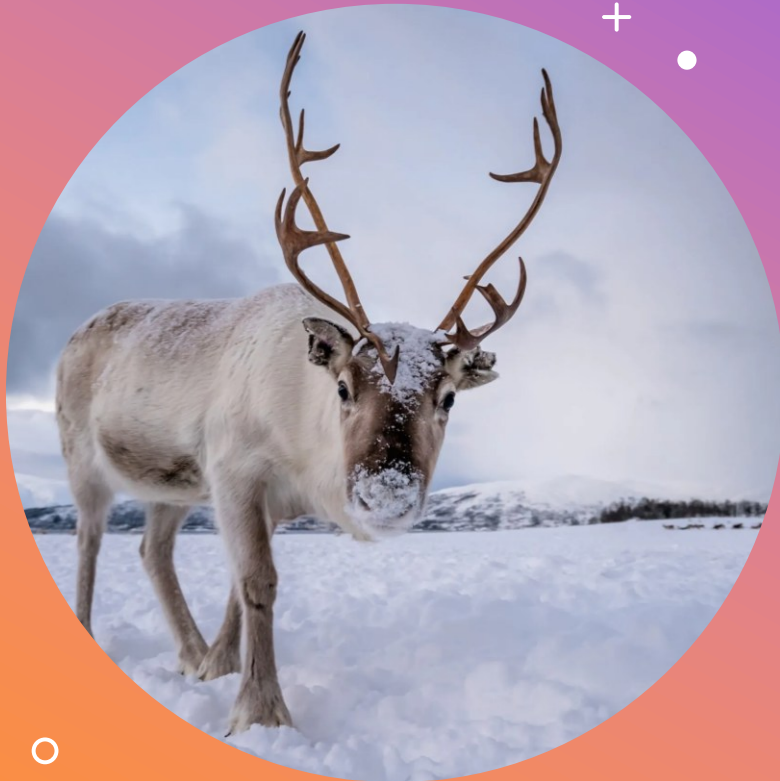

WHY FINLAND?

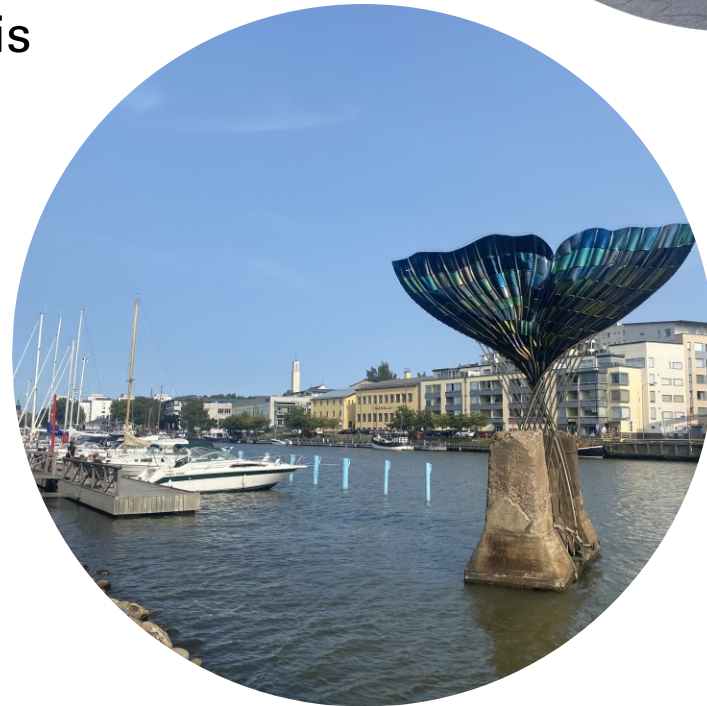
We wanted to see what veterinary medicine looks like in northern Europe, in a country where (according to research) the happiest people in Europe live.

ATTRACTIONS IN TURKU

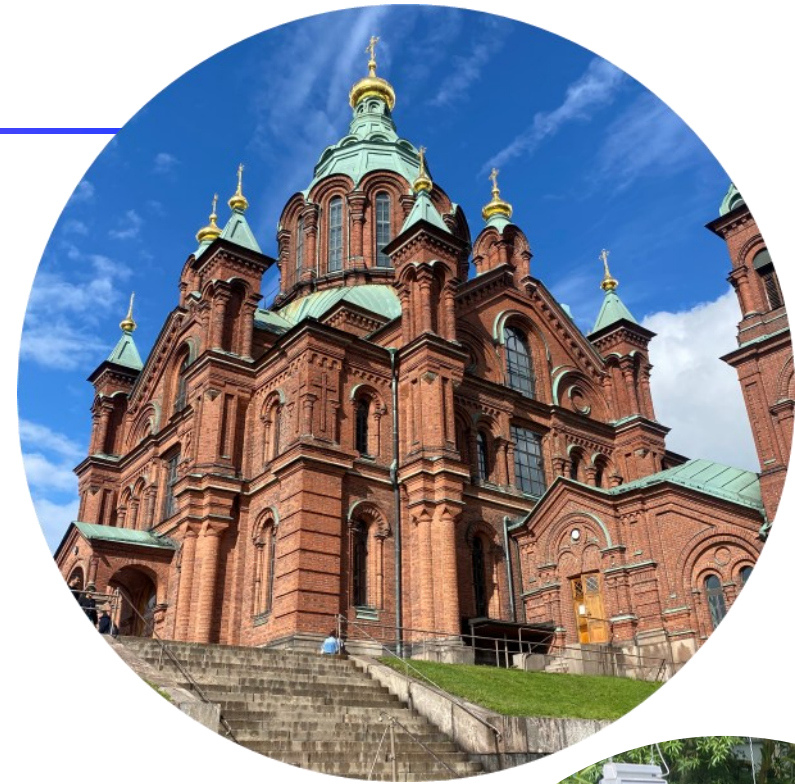
1. Museums – there are many museums that accept our student ID cards. We highly recommend Turku Castle and the Biology Museum.

Finnish food:

4. Reindeer meat – very good, tastes similar to beef.





Not far from Turku is the Moomin village. Admission is expensive, but we recommend this attraction to Moomin fans and children. The island of Naantalin itself is nice to visit and swim in, as there is a beach there.
